Social distancing is the key way to protect yourself from the transmission of COVID-19—we know that the virus can spread via surfaces, where it can live for up to 3 days, but we know it spreads more often through the sharing of droplets from the mouth and nose of those carrying the virus, even if they are asymptomatic.

The government guidance re: social distancing is that:

- We avoid face-to-face contact with others for greater than one minute.
- We avoid close proximity to others and maintain a 2m distance wherever possible. As a minimum, 1m social distancing is important for keeping ourselves safe.

In our playground, you are mostly achieving 2m of social distancing as you pick up and drop off your children. There is a pressure point at the Ive Avenue exit as we near 3pm. Please avoid joining a crowd of people by hanging back and allowing the crowd to disperse.
