Welcome back to school after the half term break—I hope you managed to find some fun in the Halloween and Bonfire celebrations the last few weeks have brought us? This half term, we are working hard to make the most of Christmas COVID-style and are going to do our utmost to ensure that the half term includes lots of fun celebrations with our children. Christmas in a primary school is definitely something we all look forward to every year, so please rest assured we fully intend to celebrate it in style, if not with all of our usual events happening in precisely the same way.... I have written to you all today to outline our plans for the school week commencing next week. From Friday 13th November for the duration of this half term at least, I have taken the decision to close school to all pupils from 12.15pm (EYFS and KS1 Reception, Year 1 & 2) and 12.30pm (KS2 Years 3-6). I need all parents to collect their children at these times. To maintain social distancing in line with all other days, the window of time for collection allows collection 1 (EYFS/KS1) between 12.15pm and 12.30pm, and collection point 2 (KS2) between 12.30 and 12.45pm. I believe this is our surest way of maintaining full opening throughout this period of high rates of infection in the community and I appreciate your support with this. Digital devices

We have spent a lot of money, this year, on Chromebooks in school so that children have access to much more technology in class, and also so that we have devices we can loan to pupils if they have to self-isolate and we need them to switch to virtual learning. In addition, we have also switched homework over to this platform, and we have also spent a lot of money on some high quality learning resources on-line. As the materials include lots of games - we know these are very popular with the children and we also know that children can and do spend hours playing the right kinds of games if we point them in that direction and make it easy and fun for them to do so! Please encourage your child to log in to their learning platforms at home to play and learn after the school day has ended.. Catching up with lost learning can be fun, and every hour invested in this is an hour towards their future success.

The Government promised us 100 free Chromebooks at Victoria... and then reduced their allocation to just 20, at the last minute. Sadly, this means that we are unable to allocate devices to pupils to keep at home all of the time, but we will be loaning out devices to any pupils who do not have one during any school closure or period of self-isolation. Please return any loaned devices as soon as they return to school, in order that they can be loaned to another pupil in need or returned to class stock.

Finally, if your child is telling you they can't yet log in to Google Classroom at home—please speak to your child's class teacher to get this resolved. We don't want to lose a minute of learning time this year, so let's do our best to switch between the real and virtual classroom overnight if and when the need arises.



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
