The Data Protection Act 1998: How we use your information

We are the Data Controller for the purposes of the Data Protection Act.

We process personal data relating to those we employ to work at, or otherwise engage to work in our schools. This is for employment purposes to assist in the running of the academies and/or to enable individuals to be paid. The collection of this information will benefit both national and local users by:

- improving the management of workforce data across the sector
- enabling development of a comprehensive picture of the workforce and how it is deployed
- informing the development of recruitment and retention policies
- allowing better financial modelling and planning
- enabling ethnicity and disability monitoring; and
- supporting the work of the School Teachers' Review Body

Data Protection Act 1998: How we use pupil information

We collect and hold personal information relating to our pupils and may also receive information about them from their previous school, local authority and/or the Department for Education (DfE). We use this personal data to:

- support our pupils' learning
- monitor and report on their progress
- provide appropriate pastoral care; and
- assess the quality of our services

This information will include their contact details, national curriculum assessment results, attendance information, any exclusion information, where they go after they leave us and personal characteristics such as their ethnic group, any special educational needs they may have as well as relevant medical information. For pupils enrolling for post 14 qualifications, the Learning Records Service will give us the unique learner number (ULN) and may also give us details about your learning or qualifications.

We will not give information about our pupils to anyone without your consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so. If you want to receive a copy of the information about your son/daughter that we hold, please contact:

We are required, by law, to pass some information about our pupils to the Department for Education (DfE). This information will, in turn, then be made available for use by the LA.

DfE may also share pupil level personal data that we supply to them, with third parties. This will only take place where legislation allows it to do so and it is in compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998.

Decisions on whether DfE releases this personal data to third parties are subject to a robust approval process and are based on a detailed assessment of who is requesting the data, the purpose for which it is required, the level and sensitivity of data requested and the arrangements in place to store and handle the data. To be granted access to pupil level data, requestors must comply with strict terms and conditions covering the confidentiality and handling of data, security arrangements and retention and use of the data.

Privacy Notice - Data Protection Act 1998: Children in Need or looked after by the Local Authority -How we use your information

We collect and process information about children in our care and children to whom we provide services. We use this personal data to:

- Support these children and monitor their progress;
- Provide them with pastoral care; and
- Assess the quality of our services.

We are required, by law, to pass on some of this information to the Department for education (DfE) which uses it to develop national policies, manage local authority performance, administer and allocate funding and identify and encourage good practice. Under certain conditions, DfE may share some of the information we provide to them with third parties (e.g. for the purpose of research). Any such sharing by DfE is strictly controlled and in compliance with the Data Protection Act 1998.

In addition to the information held by the local authority, social workers, in the course of undertaking assessments of children's needs, may seek information about families as appropriate from other agencies such as health services, probation services and voluntary sector agencies and from other publicly available sources such as social networking sites. On most occasions, the information will be sought with the consent of the individuals involved. However, there will be situations where there is a need to protect children, when information could be sought without consent.
