


Bug club is an online resource available to all pupils in VPA which gives pupils access to a huge online library of reading books targeted towards their ability with comprehension questions regarding each book they have read to test and assess their understanding.

This document will guide you through how to access Bug Club step by step and get the most out of this fantastic resource to support and challenge your child.

**Step 1: On Google (or any other search engine) search for 'Bug Club' and click on the top result.**

**Step 2: Once the Bug Club (active-learn) site has loaded move towards the 'Sign-In' section and fill in the fields with your child's username and password - class teachers will have given these out prior.**

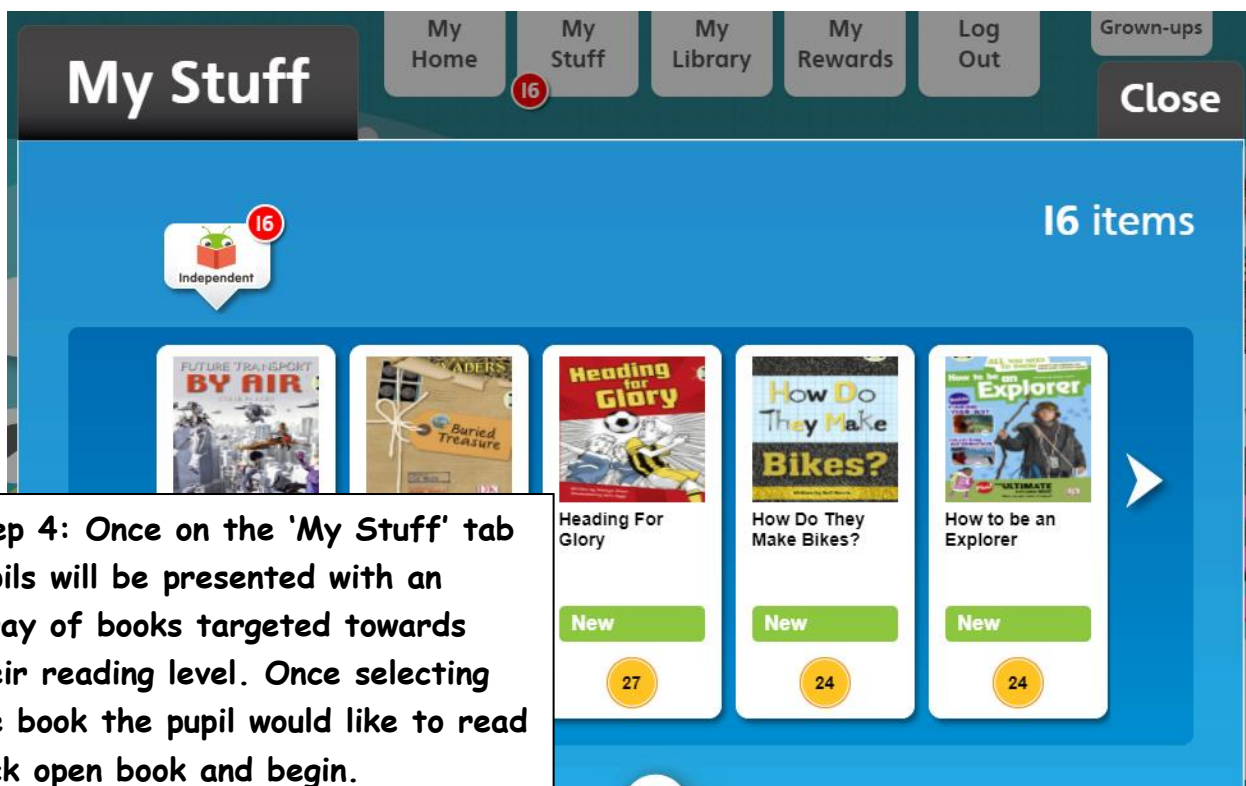

**Step 3:** When logged in your child will be presented with this screen. There are multiple tabs at the top of the screen to direct you to different areas of the resource. Under the tab 'My Stuff' there will be a notification number indicating how many books are available for your child to be working with.



**Step 4:** Once on the 'My Stuff' tab pupils will be presented with an array of books targeted towards their reading level. Once selecting the book the pupil would like to read click open book and begin.

**Step 5: Whilst reading you'll occasionally come across small images of an ant, these indicate a question around the book to assess the child's understanding and reading skill.**

Type in the missing words to complete these sentences, using capital letters where necessary. Refer back to the book if you need to.

**Step 6: Each question is personalized around the book the pupil is reading. These will test the child on a multitude of reading and SPaG skills and results sent to staff to track progress.**

**Step 7: When you have finished reading the book click the 'X' at the bottom right of the screen and the following pop-up will appear. The circular images indicate the questions to be answered throughout the book.**

**Step 8: If they're orange (like above) this means the pupil has missed select questions and will need to go back and answer them.**
